The Pastor's Corner

I ride the subway for 3 to 4 hours everyday. With that kind of time I should get a lot done, but most days I just read. Other times I play games on my phone. And still other days I watch people. And it is in the watching people that I discover God at work in ways that often surprises me.

Recently, I watched a woman open her bible. It was obvious that she spent a lot of time with it. The spine was broken. Pages were held in place with tape and the whole book held together with a ribbon and rubber bands. She opened the bible with hands that seemed to be able to read exactly what she needed to read that day and that time.

She held the frail book in her hands and then opened it to the New Testament. I couldn't see where but I knew she was probably in the Epistles. She sat and read amid the crowded train. She seemed if she had gone to another world. It was then I noticed a tear run down her cheek and a smile break on to her face. She found what she needed.

We should all be so blessed as to be able to open the book of faith and find what we are looking for in our daily lives. But that comes with a familiarity and an understanding of the book. When I was asked to consider doing a bible study, I wondered what that meant for the congregation. I wondered who would be able to come if anyone. I wondered if I knew enough.

The Word of God, the book of faith does not depend upon our knowing enough, but rather like the woman on the train, allowing God to point the way to the promise of mercy, justice and faith, through our willingness to walk through it and knowing that we indeed do not know enough. I have studied the gospels for over 30 years and every time I read them I find God offering new insights in what it means to be a member of the community of faith. Each time I read a verse I am reminded that God asks us to always look at the text in context with the saving acts of Jesus. So too are we asked to look at how God wants us to understand the condemnation that the law brings to us and that the Gospel uses that law and that condemnation to point us to the saving love of God.

We hear the Word of God in the readings on Sunday mornings but that is not enough. We hear it in the words of our worship, although most of us are unaware because the words become habit and we miss that God is speaking still. Sometime the liturgy is changed so that the way the Word of God comes to us can be heard anew, fresh through different hymns in different styles, all so that by hearing how others hear God speaking helps us to hear God in new ways. But it is not enough to hear the word only on Sunday, rather we are called to journey together into the Bible, the Book of Faith as individuals and as communities that reach out to declare, not the judgment of God, but the love of God in Jesus our Christ that calls us God's own people.

We are studying the bible and I don't know enough but with you I am learning to hear again the voice of God in the midst of the loud clanging city, the rage of competing interests, and hearing God calling us home.

Eagle Scout Project Update

Eddie P. Lyon, Life Scout, of Boy Scout troop 183 in Little Neck, NY is attempting to achieve the rank of Eagle Scout. This is the highest rank in scouting, and is a rank that only about 5% of all scouts reach. In order to become an Eagle Scout, Eddie must carry out a service project that helps the community and demonstrates his leadership skills. Since Eddie spent about 8 years in the Lutheran Social Services of New York, (LSS), foster care and adoption program he has chosen as his Eagle Scout project to provide between 75 – 100 gender and age group specific “**We Care Bags**,” for children entering the foster care system.

Since this project began earlier this year, the donations Eddie has received for it have filled an entire room at his house, and overflowed to a store room at LSS New York. Because of the generosity of so many people, by the time this project is over, Eddie will have exceeded his goal of 75-100 bags, and will have come close to filling 200 “**We Care Bags**,” for children entering the foster care system.

- 3) Display tables will be marked, and **spaces will be assigned to each vendor upon arrival.** Therefore there is no need to arrive prior to the 7:00 AM set up. **NO SPACES WILL BE RESERVED PRIOR TO SETTING UP.**
- 4) We will **not** be held responsible for any loss or injury to the exhibitor, or to any assistant or employee in connection with this flea market.
- 5) The CLC House Rules will be observed by all persons, at all times.
- 6) **No pornography or weapons.** We reserve the right to remove any merchandise deemed inappropriate. No refund will be issued if the merchandise is deemed inappropriate.
- 7) The playing of personal music is permitted with the use of headphones only.
